Sample In-Person Daily Schedule

Social Emotional Learning

- ◆ Our classroom community will continue to use a morning meeting format to promote peer to peer connections and help get ready for a day of learning.

Reading & Writing

- ◆ Student will develop literacy skills through instruction focusing on reading, writing and word study.

Math

- ◆ Our math instruction will continue to utilize our Bridges curriculum, similar to recent years.

Lunch & Recess

- ◆ Students have the opportunity to safely interact with peers and school staff. This offers an opportunity for students to engage in social-emotional opportunities. Hot lunch choices will be available.

Specialist

- ◆ Art, music, physical education and computer skills will be provided on a rotating basis.

Sample At-Home Daily Schedule

Small Group Scheduled Zoom Session*

- ◆ Students will be scheduled into 1 or 2 daily Zoom meetings of approximately 35 minutes.
- ◆ These groups will consist of about 6 students at a time.
- ◆ Students will continue their learning from the classroom with their in-person classroom teacher.

Math & Literacy

- ◆ Math and literacy skill development will progress from the previous in-person learning days through a combination of small group instruction via Zoom and self-paced independent practice.

***Kindergarten Students—At Home Schedule**

We recognize our youngest learners will be best served by a more traditional approach to At-Home learning and will need to develop their digital learning skills over time.

For this reason, At-Home Days for our kindergarten students will take on a more traditional approach, supported through independent learning activities provided by their classroom teacher. These activities will consist primarily of paper/pencil activities.

This structure will allow for smaller and more targeted in-person learning groups on the days when students are in-person.
